Due to new Tier 5 restriction as of 6.1.21 the following highlighted amendments have been made until further notice.

This risk assessment (RA) has been completed to compliment site and dynamic risk assessments to ensure SWT has considered all precautions relating to Covid-19 for all volunteers and external group members (i.e. businesses and youth activities).

Specific group requirements (Feed the Birds, volunteer species/habitat surveyors, etc.) are outlined below. Risk assessments (RAs) consider hazards, risk levels and likelihood of occurrence associated with the Covid-19 crisis. Previous site or dynamic RAs in place must also be adhered to.

Covid-19 controls required:

General terms for all situations:

If any staff or volunteer has symptoms of Covid-19 they must not present themselves for work or volunteering and follow relevant government and NHS advice to self-isolate immediately if you have any symptoms of coronavirus (a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste).

Government guidance on Covid-19 Health & Safety precautions must also be followed strictly:

Wash hands - Keep washing your hands regularly

Cover face - Wear a face covering in enclosed spaces

Make space - Stay at least 2 metres apart - or 1 metre with a face covering or other precautions

				 Wear gloves when working /surveying sites requiring the touching of tools, gate furniture and fittings, etc. is mandatory Individuals will only use equipment given to them with no sharing of gloves essential. All surfaces, tools, equipment and other objects in use will be disinfected at the beginning, end and throughout their use with suitable cleaning materials.
General: Keeping members of the public, volunteers and staff safe.	Volunteers, staff & public	HIGH	Medium	For practical tasks, work areas will be cordoned off from the public to maintain social distancing without hindering safe access. Pinch points will be avoided. Signage (e.g. whiteboard, laminated poster, etc.) will be displayed showing: -SWT logo -Activity description -Duration of activity -Lead and their contact detail for the day. Interactions with the public must be kept to a minimum, keeping at least 2 metres away at all times. Physical contact must be avoided. If using public transport masks must be worn in line with adherence to local law.

Administering emergency First Aid	Volunteers, staff & public	HIGH	MEDIUM	In line with government advice, hands must be washed or alcohol-based gel (at least 60%) used before and after treating a casualty. First Aiders must not cough or sneeze over a casualty when treated and wear a face covering when administering First Aid. Wearing gloves is mandatory when dealing with open wounds. Cuts or grazes on own hands must be protected with waterproof dressing. All waste will be bagged and disposed of safely. Wounds will not be touched with bare hands nor on any part of a dressing used on a wound. Additional masks, gloves and disposal bags will be provided in First Aid kits/safety sacks. In the case of suspected cardiac arrest recognised by absence of signs of life and absence of normal breathing.

	As of 7.10.20 we are still operating our FtB project but government guidance on Covid-19 Health & Safety precautions must be followed strictly as outlined in the general terms above. In addition, each volunteer must take every precaution to ensure their own health and safety when visiting clients e.g. washing hands, sanitising equipment, wearing masks, no physical contact.
	No volunteer should put themselves at potential danger or feel pressure to enter a client's property. Resuming indoor visits must be by mutual agreement with client, their family and the volunteer. If any party is uncertain or uncomfortable with resuming indoor visits, then the volunteer should continue to visit but not enter the property.
Surveyors	Each surveyor must travel to site independently unless travelling with others from their household /designated support bubble (as defined by government guidelines).
Branches/Local Groups	See C-19 OP for Branches and Local Groups for specific guidance.
Office-based volunteers	 As of 6.1.21 no office-based volunteers will operate until further notice. A designated member of staff must: Ensure the volunteer is conducting essential work for the Trust and that any volunteering is not possible to complete at home. Be responsible for supervising office-based volunteer(s). Ensure the volunteer(s) read and can comply with office Covid-19 safe procedures (i.e. e-Learning (iHASCO), any relevant risk assessment, C-19 operating procedure and Welcome Back Policy). Book relevant office space avoiding busy periods and/or staff who may be shielding or in a vulnerable health category. Ensure social distancing and that volunteers take responsibility for cleaning workstations at the beginning and end of daily assignments. Either be present to allow entry and exit to offices or in agreement, designate the responsibility to another named member of staff.
External groups (e.g. business involved in work well with nature; school groups, etc.)	For external groups working with SWT (not youth groups) refer to C-19 OP Working with external groups (3.9). For work with young people see C-19 OP Running youth activities (3.10) - this specifically outlines the guidance for working with youth groups based on National Youth Agency guidance that allows larger group sizes with relevant mitigation.
